Dear Members,

For the second year operating out of temporary facilities, we proved again that our Club is more than a building. We doubled down on showcasing resilience, agility and togetherness. Serving the community and thriving member and community support has been the secret to another successful season.

The BLSC hosted the full range of major Club events; the Bathing Box Classic, Pride, Pink and Blue patrols, topped off with 12 Nipper sessions and the Great Australia Day Swim. We raced competitively for the first time in the beach Masters and successfully furthered our long-standing IRB racing tradition. This year, our events centred around our spiritual home, the Bathing Boxes, instead of using multiple locations.

The Club commenced its inaugural Grommet Gurus mentoring program. Grommet Gurus is a structured mentoring program for 14 to 21-year-olds assisting them on their journey from SRC to their first day patrolling. It promotes the development opportunities within lifesaving by recruiting and fostering future leaders. BLSC is proud to participate in this important development program.

As the Club grows, so too does our operational capability. This year the Club purchased its first ever vehicle to tow trailers to competition carnivals and assist in maintenance of club equipment.

We have also committed to mobile stacking going forward for our new clubhouse, providing more flexibility with our ever changing storage requirements.

Our annual Pirate Pete Ball was a huge success. More than 80 glamorous members danced, laughed and chatted the night away at the Brighton Beach Hotel. (Rumour has it that the President’s daughter doubled down on her luck in the raffle).

Not even a temporary hiccup in the construction of our new clubhouse could dampen the spirits. With a new contractor on board, I’m confident to double down and confirm that the new building will be completed during the next season. It’s you – our extraordinary members – who provided planning, water safety and beach support. You doubled down on your commitment this season. Season 2022/2023 saw the Club and Nippers program move back to our Bathing Box beach, while we continued in temporary facilities. The team managed to navigate the challenges brilliantly with 200 Nippers and their families enrolled in the program

The season was challenging with pre-Christmas, no water activities due to an unprecedented amount of rain before the sun and beautiful clear water returned in the new year. We had an amazing support team with 7 new Age Managers and over 40 Bronze and SRC members coaching and delivering Water Safety in a volunteer capacity. We'd like to acknowledge the great job these young people do in delivering the best experience for our kids. As in past years, the feedback received is of the amazing job they do - it is really heartfelt and they provide the 'fun' aspect of the program.

The program continued to follow LSV guidelines with children learning Beach Theory, Ocean Skills, Beach Safety, Beach and Water Awareness, Bay Swimming and Paddling, along with CPR and First Aid for the older kids.

During the season we also welcomed the Dolphin Research Institute who taught our Nippers about marine life at our beach. It was a special night that highlighted to our Nippers what lives at our beach, how vulnerable it is and how to protect it.

I would like to begin with a massive thank you to Chenayde Reid, who moved from her Board position as Director of Training to take on my role of Director of Youth while I was overseas. As always, she did a tremendous job and played a big role in the success of the 2022/2023 season. Thank you Naydes!

This past season provided many opportunities for our BLSC youth with events to keep them busy across all aspects of lifesaving. Familiar and new faces got involved with new initiatives popping up for our youth to take part in.

Since Bronze Camp completion (December 2022), it has been great having many new faces appearing frequently on the beach. 12 youth members completed their Surf Rescue Certificate and 7, their Bronze Medallion. These members have now been putting their learnings into practice, helping in BLSC events – young leaders coaching our Nippers program, paddling on a board providing water safety during the Great Australia Day or Bathing Box Classic swims, learning IRB racing skills or keeping our beach safe on patrols. I am super proud of all the youth members making the most of our fantastic lifesaving community.

A great new program this season, was the Grommet Gurus! It was developed at Inverloch SLSC, who we were lucky enough to partner with to trial the program. It involves newly awarded SRC and 'Bronzies' (grommets), paired up with older mentors (gurus) at the club, ensuring our young lifesavers are supported as they begin their patrols and BLSC journey. Patrols were a hit and involved guest speakers such as Prone Board World Champion, Lachie Lansdown, our very own LSV Operations whiz, Mitch James and a lot of pizza! I would like to thank Remy Horrobin and Sami Tambanis, who brought the program to BLSC and planned all the Grommet Gurus patrols. I am so

proud of the girls - it is so awesome seeing how far they have come at the club.

One fantastic youth member was accepted onto LSV's U13 Development Camp, held at YMCA Lake Dewar in March - Isabella Larkins. A fantastic camp (54 youth members attending from across 28 clubs) providing an opportunity for Isabella to participate in teamwork and confidence building activities, enhance her interpersonal and communication skills, make new friends and broaden her understanding of lifesaving.

LSV's U18 Leadership Development Camp will be held in Somers (early December - applications out in September). Would love to have as many attendees from BLSC as possible so please contact me if interested. Also keep an eye out for LSV's annual Youth Symposium (to be held late 2023).

We are also looking for a someone to be the BLSC club member on the LSVj (Life Saving Victoria Junior) Advisory Committee. BATHING BOX CLASSIC TIM STEWART

It was great that this season, we were able to once again, hold the BLSC Bathing Box Classic. Although it would be fair to say that the weather in the lead up was certainly not favourable, we were all relieved to find that on Sunday, 6th February, it turned out to be a fine day with some nice sunshine coming through for members, participants and those supporting.

Especially taking into consideration the uncertain weather conditions in the days prior, we were very pleased to have a really good turn out with 304 swimmers registering for the event across the 2 distances of 2500km (Male & Female) and 1200km (Male & Female - by competing divisions from 12-17 years of age right through to 70+). Our event is part of the Great Victorian Swim Series and with this being the 5th time it has been held, the BLSC Bathing Box Classic, with the early February scheduling, has firmly established itself on the GVSS swim calendar.

Swimmers received their show bag with BLSC Bathing Box Classic branded long sleeve t-shirt and silicone bathing cap. Carman's, who have supported our event every year it has been held, again, very generously donated muesli bars

(participants were grateful to have access to this source of nutrition in the lead up to or post, their race) – thank you Carman's.
